ISSUE

Did Washington's Lottery (the Lottery) properly decline to pay the prize claim submitted by Brenda K. Wells on March 17, 2023?

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS

This matter was decided pursuant to a brief adjudicative proceeding. WAC 315-20-125. No testimony was taken. The Acting Director of the Lottery designated the undersigned to act as the Presiding Officer pursuant to WAC 315-20-125(2)(a).

Brenda K. Wells submitted a request for administrative review of a prize claim denial. The undersigned issued a scheduling letter on April 21, 2023. Both parties were provided the opportunity to submit written materials, including arguments, documentation, evidence and declarations. Kristi Weeks timely submitted a Hearing Brief with 6 Exhibits on behalf of the

Lottery. Brenda K. Wells did not submit any written materials, including arguments, documentation, evidence, or declarations. Both parties had the opportunity to submit responsive materials but did not do so.

The Presiding Officer considered the materials and exhibits that were submitted, together with the preliminary record as defined in WAC 315-20-125(3)(a).

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1.1 During the winter and spring of 2023, the Lottery offered for sale a scratch game entitled "Xtreme Multiplier." In accordance with the game's rules, winning Xtreme Multiplier tickets must contain a match between at least one "WINNING NUMBERS" and one "YOUR NUMBERS." Tickets without such a match are not winners.
- 1.2 Like all of the Lottery's scratch tickets, the status of an Xtreme Multiplier ticket as a winner or non-winner is determined at the time of production. A record of the status of each ticket is maintained by the vendor who produced the game and is available to the Lottery in case of a dispute.
- 1.3 On or about March 17, 2023, Ms. Wells presented a prize claim form and Xtreme Multiplier scratch ticket to the Lottery.
- 1.4 Ms. Wells' ticket was damaged. The portion of the ticket containing the bar code and serial number showed red markings. One of the WINNING NUMBERS and one of the YOUR NUMBERS was covered in a thick green substance that obscured those numbers, as well as the associated prize and multiplier.
- 1.5 Ms. Well's ticket validated in the Lottery's gaming system as either "Not a winner status" or "rejected bad check digits." It did not validate as a winner.

- The reconstruction report provided by the Lottery vendor who produced the game. 1.6 Scientific Games, showed that the ticket, as manufactured, contained no matches and was not a winner.
 - The Lottery declined to pay Ms. Wells' prize claim. 1.7
- Ms. Wells timely filed a request for administrative review of the prize claim 1.8 denial.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Director of the Lottery and the Presiding Officer, by delegated authority, 2.1 have jurisdiction over the subject of this proceeding. RCW 67.70.060.
- In purchasing a lottery ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with chapter 67.70 2.2 RCW, Title 315 WAC, the final decisions of the Director, and all procedures established by the director for the conduct of games. WAC 315-06-070.
- 2.3 A winning scratch ticket must be validated through the use of the validation number or any other means specified in rule or by the Director. WAC 315-10-035.
- 2.4 The validation number of an apparent winning ticket must appear on the Lottery's official list of validation numbers of winning tickets. WAC 315-10-070(10(h).
 - 2.5 The Xtreme Multiplier ticket presented by Ms. Wells is not a winning ticket.
 - Presentation of a non-winning ticket did not entitle Ms. Wells to any prize. 2.6

NOTICE TO PARTIES

When signed by the Presiding Officer, this Order shall be considered an Initial Order.

Any party may file a written Petition for Administrative Review of this Initial Order. A Petition for Administrative Review must state the specific grounds upon which exception is taken and the relief requested. A Petition for Administrative Review must be filed with the Director within 21 days of service of the Initial Order. WAC 315-20-125(5).

"Filed" means actual receipt of the document by the Lottery. RCW 34.05.010(6). "Served" means the day the document was personally delivered or deposited in the United States mail. RCW 34.05.010(19).

If Administrative Review is not timely requested as provided above, this Initial Order becomes a Final Order and takes effect at 5:00 pm on July 20, 2023 (21 days after service of the Initial Order). WAC 315-20-125(4).

Failure to timely file and serve a Petition for Administrative Review may result in the inability to obtain judicial review due to failure to exhaust administrative remedies. RCW 34.05.534.

Initial and Final Orders are public documents and may be released as required by the Public Records Act, chapter 42.56 RCW.
